Overview of Festival Aims

- Celebrate our borough's food cultures, community and all the incredible work happening towards a fairer, more sustainable food system
- Map where local food projects are happening, giving people an opportunity to get involved and have a hands-on experience
- Tell the story of local projects, sharing what's been learnt locally to spark inspiration
- Make space for important conversations around food justice
- Build support so our food movement continues to grow



Themes - Food & Power

- We invite you to think about the unique power of food in creative, interesting and inclusive ways
- Food is at the heart of our lives, connecting us to our food traditions, cultures, and people around us
- It links to how we care for ourselves and others
- Food makes us think about how we can take power into our own hands and reclaim our local food system, so it has the interests of our communities and the environment at its heart.

Event Categories

- Workshops
- Community cook ups/meals
- Cooking sessions
- Walks and visits (eg. touring projects)
- Panel discussions / Talks
- Networking sessions between different organisations/sectors
- Films, making or showing
- Exhibitions
- Guerilla gardening

Event Grants

- <u>Submit</u> an event or <u>apply</u> for a grant each requires completing an event hosting form
- Maximum awarded per event is £500, but we encourage you to only apply for this amount if really needed
- Limited funds we can support approximately 20 organisations with their event costs
- The grant funds can be used to cover staff costs, volunteer expenses and activity costs
- Discrétionary 'top-up' support available to make events more accessible in some circumstances
- We encourage you to partner with another organisation to maximise people and groups who can be involved
- If you don't have a space for their event, we can support with finding a free venue we have a list



Criteria to apply

- Voluntary and community organisations
- Constituted groups or club
- Registered charities
- Charitable incorporated organisations (CIO)
- Not-for-profit companies
- Community interest companies (CIC)
- Schools
- Community benefit societies

*If you are an individual or unconstituted group, you need to be 'hosted' by an organisation or constituted group in order to apply for a grant.

Events we won't fund:

- Aim to make a profit or fundraise (fundraiser events can appear in the schedule as independent events)
- Are invite-only (unless supporting a specific community)
- Do not link to the themes of food and power
- Don't take place during the festival dates or in the borough of Tower Hamlets



How to apply?

Everyone will need to complete an event hosting form whether you are applying for a grant or programming an existing event. You will need to include a photo/image.

- Section 1 Details about your organisation: name, address, legal status, social media etc
- Section 2 About your event: type, details, date/time, venue etc
- Section 3 If applying for a grant: amount, details of the costs, bank account
- **Section 4** Terms & conditions / Declaration

Accessibility - video/audio applications acceptable - make sure to cover the questions in the form

Limited support is available if you need help with completing the application



How are decisions made?

Events will be **selected** by the festival working group based on their **alignment with the festival aims, and the theme of Food and Power**.

We will also be making sure there is a **good mix of events** in terms of event type, audience, location, and time of day – thinking about who the event is accessible to.



Next steps & Key dates

- 9th June Deadline to apply for a grant and/or submit your event
- 10th-20th June The Just FACT team will get in touch with any questions about your application
- 30th June Successful grantees informed & event added to the programme
- 14th July Groups to provide any supporting information
- July/Aug First festival programme released & promotion of the festival begins
- Mid-Aug Second festival programme release with links to tickets
- 19th 28th September Festival Dates



Frequently Asked Questions

Does the event have to be for Tower Hamlets residents?

The event can be for anyone from anywhere in London or beyond. The event needs to link to the theme of food and power and celebrate local food, as well as taking place in Tower Hamlets.

Where can I find the grant forms?

Can I apply for a grant and host an event?

You can, however, the grants are intended for a host who would not be able to put an event on without the financial support.

Can I make multiple applications for a grant?

Theoretically you can, but we would encourage you to apply with one project that you're really passionate about. Please read the guidance notes on the website for more information on the types of events we're looking for.

Can the grant be used to cover staff costs?

Yes, the grant can be used to cover staff costs, volunteer expenses and activity costs.

Is a performance about food waste an appropriate event?

It could be as long as it meets the criteria of being linked to the themes of food and power and engaging with the local community, please read the guidance notes for more clarity on types of events and audiences.

Frequently Asked Questions

I want to put on a Bangladeshi meal for the Bangladeshi community, can I apply with this event? Yes, a community meal designed for a specific community is an event we would support, you would just need to explain the specificity of the audience.

Does the event have to take place during the festival dates?

Yes, only events taking place during the dates of the 19th - 28th September will be funded/supported.

I don't have a host organisation, can you help me find one?

We encourage you to have a look on the Just FACT website and contact any project partners we work with. If you contact us with your idea we may be able to suggest which partner is worth reaching out to. Alternatively you can reach out to any organisation/group in Tower Hamlets that meets the criteria for receiving funding. Please read the guidance notes on this.

If I don't have a space to run my event can you help me find one?

Yes, if you contact us with as much notice and time we can try and help you find a space to host your event. We have a small list of organisations in the borough who are happy to host but this is dependant on availability.
